058 /17	<p>OPEN MEETING TO DISCUSS THE ANAEROBIC DIGESTION PLANT – YARROW AGGREGATES, LEVEN East Riding of Yorkshire Council (ERYC) Planning application reference number: 16/03149/CM</p> <p>Cllr Morris opened the meeting.</p> <p>Mark Gillyon-Powell who is a member of the Communities Against Digesters (CAD) Working Group informed those present that in;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• 2014 ERYC granted planning permission, now lapsed application was a very small on-site proposal.• 2015 a further application was submitted for a larger commercial scoping document. A public meeting was held in Leven resulting in a mandate for the Parish Council to object to Yarrow Aggregates application, to work with neighbouring Parish Councils and allocate finances through their precept. A working group was established with members from Leven, Tickton & Routh, Skirlaugh and Brandesburton Parish Councils.• January 2017 a planning application was ratified by ERYC. A decision will be made by ERYC Planning Department on 20 April 2017. <p>Kevin Livingstone representing the Communities Against Digesters (CAD) Working Group provided the meeting with background to the Anaerobic Digester and the proposed site together with the process of transporting and feeding the digester, transportation of the end-product; digestate, storage and environmental factors impacting on;</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none">• Life quality.• Traffic.• Industrialisation of the countryside. <p>Tickton & Routh Parish Council have responded to East Riding of Yorkshire Council on 21st February 2017 objecting on factors affecting the environment, pollution, leisure, tourism, visual amenity and transport.</p> <p>Residents present at the meeting where given an opportunity to ask questions.</p> <p>The recommendation made by the residents of Tickton and Routh parishes, in attendance at the above meeting was, that if felt appropriate, Tickton & Routh Parish Council can resolve to make a financial contribution towards the Communities Against Digester (CAD) Appeal.</p>
